- Ensure all devices are fully charged.

- Create an emergency plan that includes knowing your evacuation zone and the route you will use to evacuate, if necessary.

Important things to do before a severe winter storm occurs

- Validate Authorized Users and provide current contact information
- Review and update Disaster Recovery plans
- Gather supplies for an emergency supply kit, remember to include medications for each person's needs and prepare for power outages including extra batteries for radios and flashlights
- Once it is safe and/or travel is no longer restricted, we will make all efforts to complete and reschedule affected orders

- Extended power outages

- Evacuations
- Declared states of emergency
